Frequently asked Questions Regarding the use of ATV/UTV's in Caledonia

- ~ You must be 12 years old and have an ATV certification
- ~You must be 16 years old and have an ATV/UTV certification
- ~ Minors are required to wear DOT approved helmets (bicycle helmets do not suffice)
- ~ATV's/UTV's are required to stay on the road and not use the shoulders, obey the posted speed limit
- ~Must have working headlights and taillights, use hand signals if no turn signals
- ~ATV/UTV's can cross Hwy 45 but not use the road
- ~ATV/UTV's can cross Hwy 96 but not use the road. ATV/UTV's may use Hwy 96 within the 35mph zone in

Readfield only

- ~It is state law to operate an ATV with one person, unless it is a newer ATV that is specifically made for 2 riders. After market 2nd seating is not sufficient and is illegal on town and county roads.
- ~Golf carts are not legal on town or county roads
- ~Please be safe, there is a lot of heavy commercial truck traffic in the Town of Caledonia

The above is not an inclusive list of laws and the ordinance. It includes commonly asked questions that I have received so far. The Town has received communication from residents of lack of helmets on minors, improper number of riders on ATV's, and seeing ATV/UTV's used on the state roads. Every resident should research the laws and follow them so the roads can be continued to be used by ATV/UTV's. Supervisor Bill Abba has started an Ad Hoc ATV/UTV Committee to work on questions, concerns, communication, and signage.
